Things to do immediately

Regardless of if the death occurs at home a hospital or a nursing home, your first point of contact should be to notify all of the immediate next of kin.

Often the immediate next of kin may want to attend and say goodbye before the body is removed from the place of death. Please note, your funeral director can also arrange another place in which you can see your relative again later. After all of those close have said their final goodbyes, you should call or have the nursing staff call your funeral director immediately.

Our funeral director is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is accustomed to receiving calls at all hours of the day or night

Your funeral director will arrange for the body to be transferred promptly from the place of death back to the funeral director's mortuary. For private homes and nursing homes the transfer can be expected within the next few hours. Public hospital transfers typically will not take place until the doctor has completed their certifications.
